Burnham Grammar School was converted into an academy school on 1 October 2011. When the former school, known by the same name, was previously inspected by Ofsted, it was judged to be good overall. The percentage of students supported by school activities is lower than nationwide figures. In a statement of school activity plus or special education needs, the percentage of supporting students is lower than in the country. The percentage of students from ethnic minorities is higher than the national average, and the percentage who speak English as an additional language is very high. Less than 5% of students attending school are known to be eligible for student insurance premiums (additional government funding for students known to be eligible for free meals at this school), well below the national average. The school is a partner in the established sixth form South Bucks Partnership. Schools do not use alternative regulatory arrangements for students. Since the previous inspection, a new principal and a few new senior staff have been appointed. Schools meet the government's floor standards, which set minimum expectations for attainment and development. Summary of key findings for parents and studentsIt is a good school. Student Achievement in most subjects high achieved and good with strong progress. The quality of education is good overall. Students learn new skills and develop understanding. A harmonious school community helps students get along well, feel very safe, and act well. Students social, moral, spiritual and cultural development is strong as opportunities for their cultural development increase through performing arts. The sixth form is good. Students have the opportunity to study a wide range of subjects and achieve well in most subjects. Leaders at all levels, including the governor, have contributed significantly to the improvement of the school as a whole. Strategies for improving education have been well thought out and supported by teachers who effectively expand their skills for the benefit of their students. Because it's still an outstanding school, teaching is good overall, but it needs to be more outstanding and a small minority of education still needs improvement. A few classes don't have enough opportunities for students to work on their own and deepen their understanding. Achievements in a few subjects, both in key stage 4 and sixth format, are consistently poor. Most of the country abolished state schools 11+ decades ago, but a few municipalities such as Bucks and Kent maintain large numbers of grammar schools and run county-full entrance exams. In other areas, such as Barnett and Kingston, there are a few grammar schools, along with a comprehensive system found in most countries. This grammar school will set up its own entrance exam. Sixth Form Progression 8 is designed to capture progress by the end of secondary school after a pupil has finished primary school. It is a type of value-added measure. Measure student achievement across 8 to 8 qualifications achieved. There are currently around 163 state government-funded grammar schools with 36 UK local authorities, with around 167,000 pupils in between. There are an additional 69 grammar schools in Northern Ireland, but not in Wales or Scotland. Almost half of these are in what is considered 'selective authorities' (e.g. Kent and Buckinghamshire), and around one in five local children are chosen for grammar school admission based on their ability.
